Last weekend of the school holidays – where has that time flown? Hopefully everyone will return to schools feeling uplifted, refreshed and invigorated, ready! From conversations I've had it feels like they were just the right length, but it is now time to get back into learning. Would that be a good assessment?

Last week I attended a forum hosted by Dr Hannah Tonkin, the newly appointed NSW Women's Safety Commissioner. The forum 'Working together to address domestic, family and sexual violence' drew religious and community leaders from across our region. It was great to have conversations with leaders from our multicultural and refugee hubs as well as church leaders. All front-line workers hearing and seeing vulnerable people in need.

As we know domestic violence is on the rise. 30 women this year alone have lost their lives to partners or Ex partners. Abuse takes many forms including behaviours such as isolating another, depriving someone access to independent financial support, taking their financial support away, degrading language (especially around body image or skills) as abuse or domestic violence. It's a short step for some to acts of violence.

The definition includes those who share a domestic situation e.g. people living in a share house. Our teenagers, people with a disability or the elderly can be at risk in these circumstances. Most of us probably wouldn't think about Domestic Violence as something inflicted on an individual by an individual not related by blood or marriage. And it is not experienced by one socio economic group, ethnic background, educational level, or area of society.

I was really taken by a speaker from the Saving FACE initiative undertaken by Muslim Women Australia. It is a hoping to deliver key preventive measures amongst Muslim men who use violence and other forms of abuse against women and children. I have a copy of their project 'Saving FACE – faith and cultural empowerment – a guide for reframing the way forward'. You can get your own copy by making contact with them at https://mwa.org.au/contact-us/ There are great initiatives in it for us.

The police presented a mobile phone app called '*Empower you*'. *Empower you* is an app developed by NSW Police to support people experiencing domestic and family violence. It is designed for victim-survivors of domestic violence to discreetly record evidence that can be used in court. Any of us can discreetly record data that concerns us about our brothers and sisters in need of protection potentially.

One aspect of our own Safeguarding policy and the many programs on offer is empowering good people like yourselves to be aware and then to be empowered to speak out when we see things or hear things that just aren't right. It can be subtle, as simple as someone who would normally attend Mass or an event who stops coming. It is more than bruises. Relationships that seek to isolate are not healthy ones. Asking simple questions like 'Are you Ok?', can be the most important step to assisting someone get out of a harmful situation. Religious communities like ours have a significant part to play in keeping each other and our neighbours safe.
